Pediatric Ethics Professorship



Dr. Watts appointed Dr. Cori Morrison to the Pediatric Ethics Professorship effective September 1, 2021. Dr. Morrison now leads the Pediatric Ethics Program for Children's Hospital and is responsible for ethics education in the department. Dr. Pinki Prasad Receives Recognition Award for Late Effects Program

The Children's Cancer Cause and the Stewart Initiative for Childhood Cancer Survivors awarded Dr. Pinki Prasad and her Treatment after Cancer and Late Effects Clinic (TACLE) with a \$5,000 recognition award for program impact as part of the Survivorship Champion's Prize. The reviewers felt strongly the TACLE program should be acknowledged as the only Survivorship Clinic dedicated to taking care of pediatric cancer patients in the Gulf South region and providing needed services to a very large underserved population.



The Survivorship Champion's Prize is awarded annually to a group, program, or institution making significant advances in programs and services to provide life-long health maintenance for survivors of pediatric cancers. The award recognizes the importance of the unique challenges associated with the post-treatment services for these survivors, especially as they transition to non-oncology adolescent and/or adult health care services. Alexis Smith, MD, is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Surgery in the Division of Pediatric Surgery at Emory University. She earned her MD at Wake Forest University School of Medicine in 2008. She completed her general surgery residency at the University of Maryland and Shock Trauma Center in 2015 and did her two-year pediatric surgery fellowship at Brown University in Providence, RI. She has broad experience in pediatric general surgery with special interests in pediatric trauma, ECMO management, surgical oncology, and surgical education.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

1. Explain how the Shock Index-Pediatric Adjusted (SIPA) score is used to identify critically injured children
2. Identify new trends in transfusion practices following severe trauma in children
3. Explain outcomes in non-operative management of solid organ injuries in children.

- This conference grows from the belief that limitations in our ability to help people make lasting changes in their health-related behaviors is one of

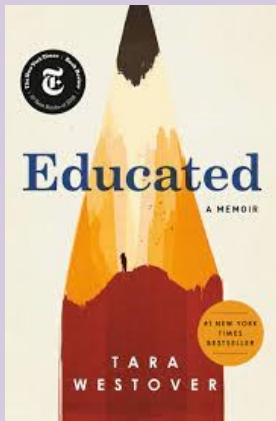
