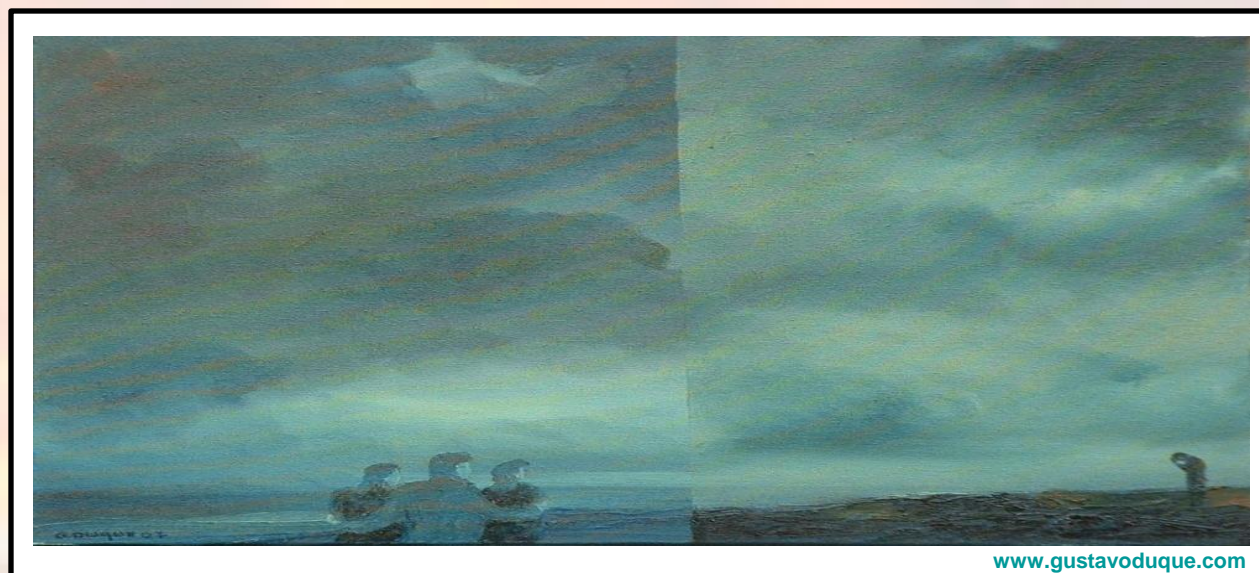

Content:

Ethical competence, palliative care, improving end of life care, and perspectives on controversial topics such as euthanasia, physician assisted suicide, end of life during disasters, and resource allocation

Intended Audience:

3. Describe the legal context of end-of-life care, and identify and correct legal myths.
4. Recognize the role of personal, cultural, spiritual, and religious values in decision making and care near the end-of-life.
5. Find and evaluate institutional and web resources.
