



INTERVENTIONAL NEWS

Boot Camp

The Interventional Radiology Residency Program hosted the annual IR Bootcamp for IR and DR residents. This was a joint effort by all training programs within the Department. The Bootcamp included training stations to help residents master skills in the following areas: fluoroscopic procedures, drains, US Guided Biopsies, Line Placement Phantom, suturing skills, and practice US on human subjects. The afternoon portion of the day was dedicated to practicing on devices utilized on the IR services. We had participation from the following Industry Partners, Penumbra, Boston Scientific, Inari, Terumo, and Medtronic. We received great feedback from residents and will continue offering this course to our residents in the future.

Interventional Radiology Research News

The IR Research Committee has been quite busy. We have had a great year in research this Academic Year. We had three residents that had posters and presentations accepted at ARRS next month in Boston, Massachusetts. Graduating resident Andrew Ea, DO, is presenting a case at the Key Case Challenge. First year residents, Robert Nguyen, MD and Hanna Javan, MD both had posters accepted as well. Dr. Hector Ferral was recognized with an Editor's Recognition Award for reviewing with Distinction in recognition of outstanding services as a reviewer of manuscripts submitted for publications in Radiographics for 2023. Dr. Ferral and Dr. Laney, in collaboration with the Emergency Medicine faculty members had an article published in Clinical Practice and Cases on "When Educational Images Don't Reflect the Population: Phlegmasia Cerulea Dolens, a Case Report" in their January Edition." The IR Research team also applied for a research grant from Nutrition Obesity Research Center, Pennington Biomedical Research Center. The committee is looking forward to their response. Our committee has currently fourteen active projects, along with six proposed projects. The committee would like to recognize our Chief Resident of Research, Jake Fontenot, MD for keeping our committee organized on our research efforts.
