In-patient service activities:

2020 – Present	28 weeks, ~10-12 hours day Time to also include on-call services, nights and weekends. RVU ~5000. Only full-time colorectal surgeon at Touro Infirmary. Worked on creating and establishing an inpatient colorectal service line. Collaborated with multidisciplinary team to expand tumor conference to include colon, rectal and anal cancers. Round on patients in the hospital ward, intensive care unit and rehabilitation units. Perform operations that consist of robotics, laparoscopy and open procedures. Procedures include both abdominal and anorectal cases. Spend about 6 days a month with 12-hour blocks doing this. I also have 4 days in endoscopy performing colonoscopy for 8-hour blocks. This time also includes time spent teaching medical students, general surgery residents and colorectal fellow in the diagnostic work up and treatment of colorectal diseases.
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Clinic coverage:

2021 – Present Touro Infirmary Colorectal Clinic 1.5 days per week since 2021 – present. From 2020-2022 Clinical duties at UMCNO for two half days and LSUHCN for one half day a week. Examine and evaluate an average of 50-70 patients a week. Patients seen in clinics include new diagnosis of colon and rectal cancer, colon and rectal cancer surveillance, benign abdominal disease, benign anorectal disease. Perform procedures in clinic which include, anoscopy, anal pap smear, high resolution anoscopy with biopsy, incision and drainage of abscess, excision of thrombosed hemorrhoid, and local wound care. This time is also spent teaching medical students, general surgery residents and colorectal fellow in the diagnostic work up and treatment of colorectal diseases.

Call:

2020 – Present Seven days at a time every three to four weeks, including weekends. Each day is a 24 hour call for about 168 hours of call every call week. Call includes consults from the emergency department, the hospital wards, and intensive care units. This also includes rounding and caring for colorectal patients at three different hospitals throughout the city. Call also includes unplanned and often emergent or urgent surgical procedures.
